**President's Letter:**

It's show time! Final preparations are being made for the annual EAGMA goat show and fiber festival in Frederick, MD, at the Great Frederick Fairgrounds. Join judge Eddie Holland and the rest of your friends on Memorial Day weekend for classes, demonstrations, competition and a whole lot of camaraderie. The festival is the major event sponsored by the association, providing members with an opportunity to sell their wares by vending fiber products, selling a few goats to visitors, and sharing experiences for the benefit of all. Many of my most valuable nuggets of information were gleaned from past festivals. It is particularly beneficial to newer producers as they move forward with their new venture. It is one of the few times during the year that I can immerse myself in my obsession with goats, and share that interest with friends who appreciate this passion. Most of the year, people just look at me and politely smile, while inwardly asking themselves if I am crazy!

Remember to pack up your excess fiber, as there will be a mohair pool. This is a chance to clean the cupboard, and it will be two years before you get this chance again. I would caution all who are considering bringing colored fiber, as the warehouse merely considers this "tag and stain," paying only about one dollar a pound – less the transport fee of \$0.40 per pound. You are likely better off selling it yourself or processing it into a value-added product. I will be transporting the mohair to Texas this summer. Timing is still up in the air, but can be coordinated with the Habey, Lockhart, Ross, Speck goat auction being held on Saturday, 16 July if anyone is interested in having animals transported back to the mid-Atlantic region. If you are interested in participating in the auction and/or having animals transported, please contact me prior to or at the show so we can coordinate the trip.

Please join me in thanking the board members as they have all worked hard to make this a great show. The entire board has worked diligently to help plan and coordinate the show. I would like to specifically thank Adrienne Bodie, who has coordinated the financial obligations, Greta Dise has checked and double check to make sure the forms on the web are up to date and we are ready, Colleen Reed manages to function as show coordinator, pulling together sponsorships, advertisers and goat registration into the program that is so valuable to all who participate, and Karen Schlossberg has worked diligently to keep all the information up to date on the web. This is a big time commitment for all involved. Please thank these and the other board members for a job well done at the show.

Lastly, I would like to recognize Steve Harder, past president of EAGMA, who passed away on the eve of Easter. Just as Easter is a time of rebirth, Steve will always be a part of our activities. He was the driving force for the association for so many years. If it were not for his efforts, it is very likely that there would be no EAGMA. ## WORKSHOPS & CLASSES DESCRIPTIONS

### **Marketing Mohair, \$15; presented by Terry Kunst, Twin Ponds Fiber Farm**

Description: "So you have bags of mohair -- now what are you going to do with it?" This workshop will discuss ways to produce Value Added products, and companies who can help you create them.

Examples of products including socks, bags, yarn, felt, and roving, as well as information on mills that can or can't process your fibers will be reviewed. We'll also look at what fibers blend well with mohair, different breeds of sheep's wool, llama, alpaca, and angora bunny.... Marketing Mohair is never a done deal. As long as you're in business, you've got to be looking toward the future.

Requirements: There is no equipment required; this is a class for all levels.

### **Guardian Dogs, free workshop; presented by Kristina Lawwill, Peavine Hollow Farm**

Description: Livestock Guardian Dogs - The biologically correct predator control... or how to become an unpopular neighbor! Discussion topics will include pros and cons of using LGDS (or not) as part of a predator management control program, how they work, how to deter unwanted behavior, socializing, the use of guardian dogs as companion animals and our thoughts on how to select a breeder and how a good breeder chooses new clients.

### **Advanced Spinning, \$45, registration requested; presented by Phylleri Ball, Steam Valley Mountain Fiber Farm**

Description: This workshop will begin by evaluating your own handspun yarn for Wraps per Inch, Twist or Bumps per Inch and Yardage per Pound. How do you create yarn that is suitable for its intended use? Learn how your handspun yarn is affected by your choice of fiber preparation and drafting techniques, the influence of drive ratios on twist and various methods of plying. Gain a greater understanding of yarn structure and how to achieve the results you desire in your handspun yarns. Master the ability to spin a range of yarn weights from a chunky rug yarn to a durable fingering weight sock yarn.

Requirements: Bring three different handspun skeins of yarn for class evaluation, including one yarn which you consider unsatisfactory. Provide your own spinning wheel with 3 bobbins, lazy kate, range of flyer whorls and niddy noddy. Bring your own hand cards and flick carder if you have them. This is an intermediate level class.

### **Youth Showmanship, free workshop; presented by Becky Salinger and family, Gypsy Ridge Farm**

Description: Learn the proper way to show an angora goat for 4H, FFA, country fairs, and a great thing to know for showing goats at the EAGMA show too. We will also discuss preparing your goat and yourself for the show ring. Children participating will be taught how to show properly so that they can be competitive in showmanship classes against children showing dairy and meat goats as well as fiber goats.

### **Spinning Novelty Yarn, \$45, registration requested; presented by Phylleri Ball, Steam Valley Mountain Fiber Farm**

Description: Novelty yarn, also referred to as Art Yarn, is fun to spin and adds texture and intrigue to your spinning. Texture can be created in subtle or grand ways, depending on your spinning style. Explore techniques to create novelty yarns and add to your spinning repertoire. You'll discover new ways to incorporate mohair into your yarns.

Requirements: Provide your own spinning wheel with 3 bobbins, lazy kate range of flyer whorls, and niddy noddy. (Materials will be provided as a portion of your class fee.) This is an intermediate level class.

### **Needle Felt a Farm Animal, \$15, especially for children; presented by Heidi Passino and Amy Cooper of Woolly Bullfrog**

Description: This class is a kids-focused needle felting class. We will introduce children to the wonder of needle felting through creating an animal (or a few) from beautiful mohair.

Requirements: Enthusiasm. There is no equipment required; this is a class for all levels.

## CALL FOR SPONSORS

## **Mohair Pool At the EAGMA Annual Show**

Every two years EAGMA provides an opportunity for you to sell your mohair in the warehouse in Texas. Typically, this is held in conjunction with the annual show. To facilitate the collection of mohair, I would like to provide you some information about the process.

**Skirting** – All mohair to be included in the pool must be well skirted. All tags and stain must be removed. Any second cuts, short hair or damaged hair, and debris must be removed.

**Grading** – Fleeces should be graded into kid, yearling, adult, and tags (including stain).

- These are grades, not necessarily the age of the goat that produced the hair. Kid grade hair is 28 micron or less, yearling, from 28 – 38, and adult is more than 38 micron. While it is not necessary to measure the diameter of the fiber to grade your hair for the pool, you should evaluate the hair based on your best attempt to determine fineness and handle of the fleece.
- You should also grade individual fleeces for uniformity. Leg and belly hair may grade coarser than the rest of the hair, and should be placed into the appropriate grade.
- The other factor is fleece length. If you are shearing on a regular, 6 month schedule, then your fleece is likely all in the same grade, about 5 – 6 inches of hair. If your hair is more than 6 inches long or less than 5 inches, it should be graded and bagged separately.
- Lastly, any fleeces with excessive kemp should be graded separately.
- Please note that the warehouse deals with all colored fleeces as tags and stain, regardless of grade.

**Bagging** – If you have 50 lbs or more of hair in grade, please bag your own fleece. The bag should be clearly labeled with your name and grade of hair in the bag. Do not use the woven polyester feed bags, as the warehouse will reject these bags.

It is important to grade your hair well since it will be combined with others hair. The hair will be checked at the warehouse and if the bag is not uniform, the whole bag will be penalized with a lower selling price impacting all producers in the bag. Your fleeces will be reviewed at check-in. If fleeces are not well prepared according to the above criteria, hair may be rejected for shipment.

Your hair will be weighed at the drop-off and you will be given a receipt for the pounds of hair in each grade, a copy will remain with EAGMA, and a copy will go to the warehouse. You will be required to write a check for the transportation charge of \$0.40 per pound. This fee will help partially offset transportation costs. Once at the warehouse, the fleece will await sale. Once sold, the warehouse will issue checks. The EAGMA secretary will then divide the check, according to the receipts collected, and issue checks to the individual producers. This process will take from several weeks to several months, depending on the sale of the hair.

**In Memory of  
Steve Harder**

Steven "Steve" Shadle Harder, 59, of Free Union, Virginia, died on Saturday, April 23, 2011, after heroically battling pancreatic cancer for many months. He died peacefully on his farm in Peavine Hollow, surrounded by his loving family and dear friends who had come together to join in his care with love and devotion.

Steve was the beloved husband of Pat Harder. In 1994, they married and together they made a family. Along with their children, the family grew to include children-in-law, grandchildren, and many cousins, nieces, and nephews.

Steve was preceded in death by his parents, William and Barbara Harder, and by his sister, Lyn Shaw of Queen Anne, Maryland, who was also a pancreatic cancer warrior. His life was greatly enriched by the many friends he had - some since his childhood and some that he made in his later life.

He leaves behind a legacy of humility, grace, and acceptance. He never questioned, "Why me?" He and Pat worked as a team throughout their marriage as they raised children and goats, and no less so during his cancer journey. Steve's humor, optimism, and faith sustained them through the hills and valleys of treatment.

Steve was a true craftsman whether in building and remodeling homes or relationships. He was dedicated to service, professionalism, and community and never backed down from a challenge. He was particularly

proud of his twenty years of sobriety. Steve showed us how to live a life of quality and die with dignity and strength.

**Steve's Memorial**

Steve's memorial service was a glorious day in the traditional sense of the word. We celebrated the glory of a life well lived and of a family well loved. It was a gathering of friends and a celebration of life that was incredibly genuine and spiritual. We listened to Pat read the 23rd Psalm. We all recited together the Prayer of St. Francis. Those who loved him best gently roasted him as though we were toasting Steve's best accomplishments at a birthday party, not wishing him a last farewell.

Pat told us of Steve's last visions of peace, with his dog by his side and his goats in the fields around him. Steve himself picked out his last resting place, on the green hill with a view of the valley.

Many people drove for two and three hours to get to the service. The bright little church was filled to standing room only, and afterwards people spilled over the lawn from cemetery to church door. The tables overflowed with food; the few flower bouquets blended into the sunshine. It was a beautiful day, and well deserving of Steve's final hurrah.
