President's Letter:

What a weekend! The Shenandoah Fiber Festival had two complete shows, including fleeces, in one weekend. It was an unbelievable weekend that was action packed; no one could complain that there was not enough to do. Fred Speck and Joe David Ross were great judges, as always. The weekend provided so much information from two of the most knowledgeable goat producers in the world. The people that interned with both had a once in a lifetime experience. The festival offers an inexpensive venue, with lots of foot traffic to educate and to which to sell goats and fleeces. Despite the rain, there was good participation at the shows. It was also extraordinary to compare the results for the two shows. Basically, the shows offered the same goats with two different judges. It is interesting to see the similarities, and difference. Take a look at the results later in the newsletter.

My sincere thanks to Kristina Lawwill, Peavine Hollow Farm, for all the hard work, fabulous accommodations, coordinating judges, handling registrations, and all the other things that went into chairing the show. Thanks also to Kristina L. and Becky Salinger, Gypsy Ridge Farm, for their financial support of the show. There is great promise for this venue, so much so, the board has voted to host a show again on 29 and 30 September 2012 at the SVFF in Berryville, VA. Details about the show and accommodations will be posted soon on the website. So put it on your calendar now; I look forward to seeing you there.

On to the future: the spring EAGMA show will be in Wooster, OH at the Great Lakes Fiber Show this Memorial Day weekend 2012. We have contacted the show board and they are excited to again have an Angora goat show at the festival. The goat show will be 26 and 27 May and the judge will be Sharon Chestnutt of Cloudspun. A tentative schedule is posted on the GLFS web site and will soon be up on the EAGMA website. This is a change in venue, discussed at last year's show, which will greatly reduce show costs and provide much greater visitation to our show and sales. We are working out the details to have the fleece show/sale combined with the overall festival's show and sale but we will likely need volunteers to help the festival staff to manage the mohair portion. Note that the shearing requirement no longer is 1 January but has been changed so goats must be shorn within 6 months prior to the show. This means any goat shorn after 26 November is eligible to participate.

The membership elected two new members to the board, Connie Deatherage and Amy Maher. Please join me in congratulating them on their joining the board. Their fresh view will be very helpful as we make decisions on your behalf. It is wonderful to see active participation by new members; after all it is your association. This is your chance to make sure the association functions to address your needs. I appreciate your support through your annual dues and participation in shows but there are many more members than those that participate in shows and vote in elections. Let me, or one of the other board members know what you are thinking.

EAGMA Board of Directors Meeting Minutes November 6, 2011

Attendees: John Frett, Pat Kalitka, Leslie Orndorff, Colleen Reed, Karen Schlossberg, Pat Harder, Kristina Lawwill
Absent: Mindy Hook, Adrienne Hall Bodie

Approval of Minutes: No minutes since previous newsletter.

Treasurer Report (previously submitted by Adrienne Bodie): After payments for SVFF and pending deposits are processed, we have working capital of \$1,826.76.

Membership Report: 49 current members; 13 lapsed members (who will be culled for 2012).

No further questions regarding SVFF. (All questions were answered via e-mail prior to the meeting.)

Elections:

- Pat Kalitka is resigning from the board for personal reasons, but will continue on in an advisory capacity.
- John will let the newly elected members know about their elevation to the board and invite them to the Feb meeting.
- The new shearing date cut-off of "six months prior to the show" motion passed. Therefore, the shearing cut-off date for the 2012 show in Wooster is November 26, 2011. Any goat shorn after that date is eligible for the show.

2011 EAGMA Show - SVFF

Discussion centered on whether we would repeat this show.

- Anti: The show did incur a loss. And there were disappointments regarding attendance. Test requirements are stricter (and more expensive) than other states.
- Pro: We've learned from the initial experience. We had enthusiasm from SVFF and from participants. We have already heard from people who want to come.

Proposal to repeat SVFF as a single judge show, with fleece contest and sale. Roll Call Vote: 6 yes, 1 no, 2 abstentions. The movement passed.

- Greta & Pat K. have volunteered to support the show organization/running it.
- Judge nominations: Robin Giles; Connie Ross
- Kristina will contact SVFF regarding joining them again. [P.S. They confirmed YES.]
- John will contact potential judges. [P.S. Sharon Chestnutt of Cloudspun has confirmed for the EAGMA spring show.]

Website updates

- The pages and framework have been established. The design allows for separate content owners for each page or subject. It is ready for content migration.
- Pat H. needs to go through the migration with Karen and Greta regarding population of the rest of the content. Pat H., Greta, and Karen will meet next Sunday via conference call.

Spring Show

- 2012 Show at Great lakes Fiber Festival, 26 & 27 May 2012
- The expenses for Wooster are \$350 for the barn and the costs of the judge (estimated at less than \$1000).
- Judge – Nominations: Sharon Chesnutt (Greta will send John her contact information); Debbie Krug
- Program – White on Saturday, Colored on Sunday.
- Advertising in MDS&W – it's a \$300 advertisement in the catalog. We will not be doing the placement in the show catalog this year.
- Greta will ask Sara for the old advertisement in a file format that we can modify ourselves.

New Business:

Kentucky Sheep & Fiber May 18-20, 2011 has invited us to their show in Lexington. Perhaps we could look at that for 2013 to accommodate the more southern members. This decision should be made by July 2012 to announce to participants.

SAFF has reminded us that there is an Angora goat show next year.

Next board meeting is Feb 5, 2012 via phone.

Next board meeting is April 22, 2012 in person.

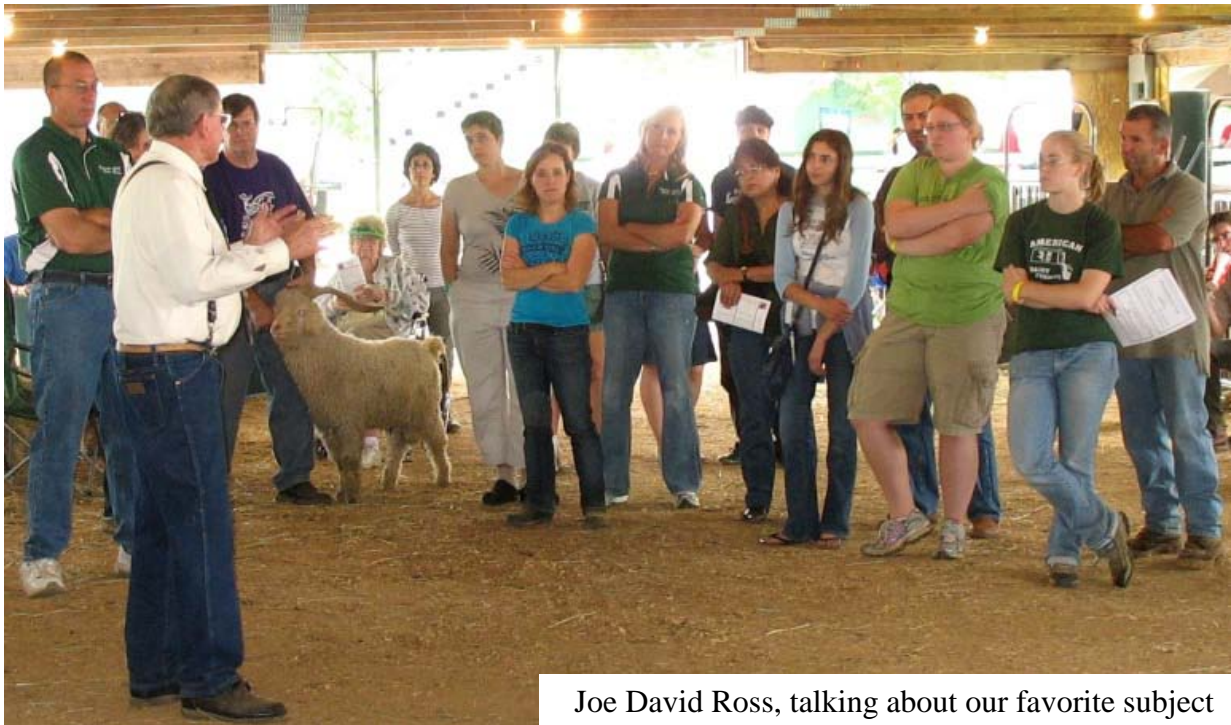

After the show was completed, Ms. Hadorn spoke to all of the producers regarding the hard times that the southwest is suffering in the drought, and told us about the forced sell-offs that are going on in the big Texas herds. Ms. Hadorn emphasized to us that our breeding choices are going to affect the future of Angora genetics for generations to come.
