# EAGMA Fall Show at Shenandoah Valley Fiber Festival Berryville, VA

The 2012 EAGMA fall show will be in conjunction with the Shenandoah Valley Fiber Festival at the Clarke County Fairgrounds in Berryville, VA. The show will be the last weekend in September, the 29<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup>. In order to encourage maximum participation in this show, there is no shearing date cut-off for this show. Goats should be shown in age appropriate (kids in first or second clip, yearlings in third or fourth clip, adults in fifth or later

clip, and no goat should be shown with more than a 6-month fleece (less than 6" of growth). This is to encourage a uniform standard for animal health in display to our show audience.



# Angora Goat Show at The New York State Sheep and Wool Festival Rhinebeck, NY

Be sure to make your reservations and plans for your trip to Rhinebeck, NY, for the New York State Sheep and Wool Festival on October 20-21, 2012. This is the last major New England fiber festival for the year, and both the goats and the fall colors are not to be missed! This show has plenty of space to house the competition. It has a well-established area for the does, wethers, and kids, and a separate tent for the bucks (with special solid-sided

Historically, the New York State Sheep and Wool show has had exceptionally strong fleece sales for mohair, especially colored fleeces. The entry process for fleeces is online only, and is completely separate from the Angora goat show itself.
