Instructions as to how to prepare your mohair are one the webpage under the mohair pool tab. We will once again use the warehouse in Rocksprings Texas. They grade your mohair for best price. There is a \$0.17/pound charge for this, but it is worth every penny.

Reminder: membership dues are due in January. To help build our membership we offer a "gift" membership for \$10.00. If you sell a goat to a new breeder or someone not already a member, you may buy them a "gift" membership to get them started.

## Meeting Minutes from EAGMA meeting Rhinebeck, NY, 10/18/2015

We began the meeting with a discussion about the EAGMA show at the Shenandoah Valley Fiber Festival. Premiums were paid for the top fleeces this year but will not be next year. We need to work on timing for the fleece show. There was confusion this year about the time fleeces had to be entered. Some people thought fleeces could be entered until 5:00 but the fleece show folks wanted them there by 3:00. We will try to be more clear communicating information next year. Animal drop off will continue to be all day on Friday.

There were sixty-four actual goats entered this year but they filled over 100 spots in all the classes because we added several new classes. We decided we would keep them for next year including the Red Card class.

We then talked about the Rhinebeck show. Even though there were not enough goats to offer the In and Out class this year we will try to have it next year. It was suggested that this should be a kid class because it is easier to fill. We will decide whether it will be buck or doe kids soon. Dan will check into us having our own shearer because the sheep shearer provided by the show does not really like shearing goats.

Dan said there were only fifty-eight goats entered in the show this year and that we need more in the future to

justify the show. Next we talked about the electronic registration and that it is here to stay. We also need more clarification about what goats make up the Breeder's Class. Should it include a buck? Will specifying a particular make-up of the group exclude more people that it attracts? (Some people don't bring bucks to the show.) We might look at what dairy goat shows do. Finally Dan talked about the electronic registration program they are using and its capacity to generate a show program. We will have to see how the content can be customized. We will know more for next year.

## Shenandoah Valley Fiber Festival 2015 EAGMA Show Results

The 2015 EAGMA Angora Goat Show was held in conjunction with ACAGR Nationals at the Shenandoah Valley Fiber Festival in Berryville, VA on September 26-27, 2015. The judge was Sharon Chestnutt from Cloudspun Angoras in Monroe, Oregon. Ten farms participated in the competitions, and MacGregor Hollow Farm participated *in absentia* through sponsorship.

In Ms. Chestnutt's opinion, the yearling classes were the "no excuses" classes. Ms. Chestnutt explained that, in her judgment, yearling goats were the right age to start making decisions regarding breeding and sales. To her, the fall yearlings should show the physical conformation that the goat will have into its adult years while also showing the best version of a fleece – hopefully still kid-fine but also matured into its adult lock style.

## Navy Goats: The History, The Rivalry, The Vet Visits...

Bill the Goat XXXV (35) and XXXVI (36) made their debut as “mascots in training” when they joined Bill XXXIII (33) and XXXIV (34) for the U.S. Naval Academy vs. U.S. Airforce on October 3, 2015 at the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The two senior Angora goats have served as mascots since 2007. They will continue to do so until the training of Bill 35 and 36 is complete and their retirement is approved.

In keeping with Navy tradition, the newest Bills – 19-month-old twins – are white male Angora goats. They were donated to the Naval Academy by long-time Navy fans James and Tracy Ross from Harper, Texas.

Team Bill, the midshipmen who take care of the goats, and the Academy staff, are working to keep the new mascots safe and healthy, and avoid the damage done to the personalities of the senior mascots, Bill 33 and 34. Due to repeated kidnappings and the other unfortunate experiences, the senior Bills are now very wary of people and easily irritated by the crowds. The youngsters are – at least right now – much more personable and interested in interacting with people.
